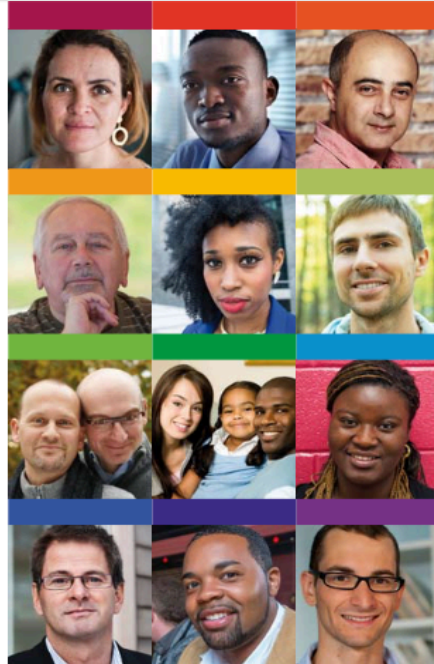

Background

- Relevance for delivering equitable high-quality services that secure best possible outcomes for PLWH
- A reference point ...to benchmark the quality of HIV care
- Relevant to anyone involved in provision of services
 - Service providers
 - Commissioners
 - PLWH
 - But I have concerns...
- Cover 8 areas

Each Standard has...

- Specific, concise statement
 - Recognising one size will ***not*** fit all
- Rationale
- Quality statements
- Measurable and auditable outcomes

1. Testing, Diagnosis and Prevention
2. Person-centred Care
3. HIV Outpatient Care and Treatment
4. Complex HIV Care
5. Sexual and Reproductive Health
6. Psychological Care and Mental Health
7. HIV Across the Life-course
8. Developing and Maintaining Excellent Care

Each section has sub-sections

Each section has a lead writer and a community rep

Discussion on UK-CAB Forum

- Focus on the Statement, rationale and quality statements
 - If you have concerns about measurables, use BHIVA
- There will be differing views!!
 - We won't get consensus...some people will not agree with final version!
 - We recognise “one size doesn't fit all”
 - Don't hang back - say what you think
 - But of course, be polite and respectful of other views
- My concerns about the Standards being used by PLWH...
 - They are long, and the measureables are not really relevant
 - The language is rather academic and clinical
 - Need a “guide” or lay version
 - Some in BHIVA Disagree
 - BHIVA struggling to fund this
